Make a Year of the Tiger Lantern

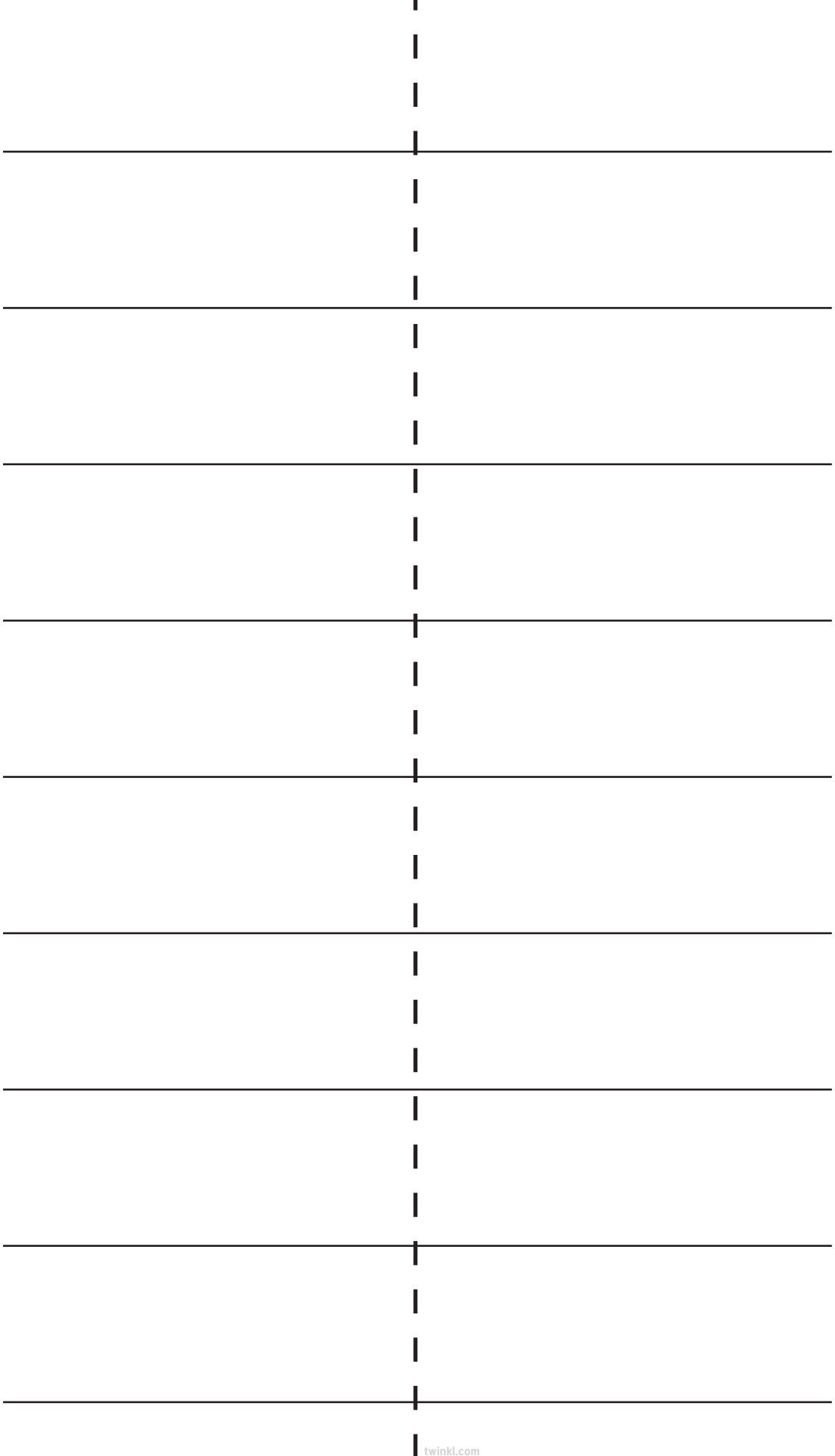
You will need:

- Printout of lantern template on white card
- Printout of lantern template with tiger stripes on paper
- Printout of tiger features template on white paper
- Scissors
- Sticky tape
- Glue stick



Instructions:

1. Start by printing out the lantern template onto white card then print out the lantern template with tiger stripes and tiger features template on white paper.
2. Stick the lantern templates back to back so that they line up perfectly. You will have a white side and a side with tiger stripes. Let the glue dry.
3. Carefully, cut off the end of the lantern template (labelled handle). Keep this safe for later. It might be a good idea to put your name on it.
4. With the tiger side facing up, fold the lantern template in half along the dashed line.
5. Carefully, cut along each marked line. Don't go too far - stop cutting at the end of each line.
6. Unfold the lantern template. With the white side facing up, fold the lantern template in half again along the dashed line. Open it up again with the tiger stripes facing up. Join the short edges together and tape the outer and inner edges to hold it in place. Gently, push down on top of the lantern so that the cut strips stick out.
7. Carefully, cut out the tiger features, taking care not to cut off any tabs. Glue the eyes and nose in place (have a look at the illustration to help).
8. Fold the ears along the dashed lines and stick the tabs to the lantern.
9. Finally, attach both ends of the handle to the inside of the lantern using sticky tape.
